This year's event is being organized virtually, both at the provincial and national level. An exciting combination of live-streamed events and pre-recorded job sector videos will allow teachers, parents and students to explore a variety of career pathways on, or even after November 3rd.

This event is open to any grade 9 child of civil service employees and to all grade 9 teachers who wish to participate as a class. Students are not encouraged to visit their parent's worksites; however, parents/guardians who want to take their child to work, should only do so as long as it is feasible, can be done in accordance with their workplace's CPHO guidelines, and with supervisor approval. Students are encouraged to engage in the same learning activities whether they participate with a parent/guardian at a workplace, or virtually from school.
